Strategic Plan Update

In March 2023, with a vision to continuously meet the needs of our students and drive positive change, the process of designing a new Strategic Plan for the School District of New Richmond began. During phase one, the Assessment Phase, data was collected from the New Richmond community and the district overall. Over 649 online survey responses were received along with feedback from principals, school board members, community groups, two world cafe community feedback events, and input from staff within all five school buildings.



In June 2023, the School District of New Richmond partnered with Kristin Wiersma of Focus Consulting to assist with identifying the district's strengths, opportunities, aspirations, and recommendations.

Support from our community, dedicated staff members, and a variety of activities for students to participate in were highlighted and identified as some of the district's greatest attributes.

A crucial topic immediately identified as an area of concern for many, is the current state of district facilities and future growth of the New Richmond community. To proactively address this concern, the School District of New Richmond partnered with Wold Architects and Engineers. In addition, a Core Planning Team was established composed of community members, parents, staff, and school board members. This team would work in conjunction with Wold Architects and Engineers in hopes of providing fresh perspectives, generating new ideas, evaluating, and offering effective solutions.

In August 2023, the Board of Education selected and approved School Perceptions, an independent education research firm, to solicit a community wide survey and collect feedback and information regarding facilities and district

SDNR Emergency/Inclement Weather Procedures - Updated 10/20/23

On behalf of the School District of New Richmond, we would like to remind everyone of our protocols with school closures and other District emergency procedures. Please know that everyone who is enrolled in our Emergency Communication System will receive communication in the form of an email, phone call, and/or text message of any school closure. We will also have the announcement published on local TV stations and district social media platforms, and we will inform the WCCO radio station.

Should inclement weather or other emergency situation(s) require the District to close school(s), the following procedures will be followed:

On the first school closure day of the 2023-2024 school year due to inclement weather: There will be no school for students.

On the second school closure day and all following closure days of the 2023-2024 school year due to inclement weather: Students will participate in a Distance Learning Day as defined by their school building.

When School is Closed:

- Automated calls will be placed to parent/guardian contact information as soon as possible using the District's Emergency Notification System if conditions warrant the closing of schools.
- Listen to radio station WCCO (AM 830) and/or watch WCCO-Channel 4, KSTP Channel 5, FOX

 Channel 9, or KARE Channel 11 for announcements. Announcements will also be posted on the district website and social media pages. Normally decisions are called in BY 5:30 a.m., but there can be delays in getting through or having the announcement read.
- Determination and communication on all after-school activities will be decided by approximately NOON. This includes practices, rehearsals, open gym, games, concerts, Community Education, etc.
- Tiger Pack will remain open from 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m. for students with the additional school closure contract. Guardians can sign up online through Eleyo (https://newrichmond.ce.eleyo.com/) for the separate school closure contract for \$15.

• NR4K is canceled.

NEW! Tiger Pack open from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. for students with the additional school closure contract.

When School is Delayed (Late Start) or Dismissed Early:

- Automated calls will be placed to parent/guardian contact information as soon as possible using the District's Emergency Notification System if conditions warrant a delay or early dismissal of schools.
- Listen to radio station WCCO (AM 830) and/or watch WCCO-Channel 4, KSTP Channel 5, FOX Channel 9, or KARE Channel 11 for announcements. Announcements will also be posted on the district website and social media pages. Normally decisions are called in BY 5:30 a.m., but there can be delays in getting through or having the announcement read.
- For an early dismissal, all after-school activities are assumed to be canceled with an early dismissal unless there is an announcement, or information specifying otherwise. This includes practices, rehearsals, open gym, games, concerts, Community Education, etc.
- If there is a 1 hour late start, Tiger Pack will open at 7:00 a.m.
- If there is a 2 hour late start, Tiger Pack will open at 8:00 a.m.
- If there is a 1 hour early dismissal, Tiger Pack will close at 5:00 p.m.
- If there is a 2 hour early dismissal, Tiger Pack will close at 4:00 p.m.
- If there is an early dismissal, the afternoon NR4K classes will be canceled.

These are guidelines and may be adjusted in accordance with the circumstances and weather conditions. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding.

Kindergarten Speech/Language Screenings - By Carey Reetz, SLP

This notice is to inform parents that ALL Kindergarten students will be screened for possible speech/language concerns at each of the elementary schools during the last two weeks in November starting November 20th. These screenings are done to identify students that may need further speech/language testing/evaluation and will be conducted by the school district's speech and language pathologists.

All children will be screened in the areas of sound production, sentence construction, understanding, voice ability, and stuttering. If your child is in need of further testing, you will be contacted by one of the district speech/language pathologists. If you have any questions, concerns, or would like to opt out of the screening, please contact the speech-language pathologist at your son's or daughter's school. If you do not contact the speech language pathologist at your child's elementary, this serves as consent to screen your child.

Early detection of potential delays can provide an opportunity for additional support in language development.

Why Screen for Speech and Language Development?

Speech and language skills are used in every part of learning and communicating with other children in school and are a critical part of early literacy development. Early detection of potential delays can provide an opportunity for additional support in language development.

What can I do to help my child's language development?

The American Speech Language Hearing Association recommends several ways that parents and caregivers can help children meet speech and language milestones, including:

- Ask children to identify objects based on descriptive clues
- Ask children to give you directions and follow them
- Give children your full, undivided attention when they speak
- Allow children to respond to you
- Practice building vocabulary
- Encourage children to ask questions if they don't understand what a word means
- Read stories with age-appropriate plots
- Ask questions Who? What? When? Where? Why?
- Include children in planning and discussing activities

Another HUGE thank you goes out to all the folks who adopted our May calves - Krastyo Malinov, Jefo Nutrition, Annette Noak with her awesome grandchildren - Kyler, Brayden and Everett, and the Rasmussen family - Trent, Chelsea, Sadie and Grace. We wouldn't be able to offer this opportunity and raise steers without the farmers - thanks to our friends at Minglewood, the Raymond Family and the Van Dyks for partnering with us to get these calves to the SOAR Center!





One of our interesting things this summer was Leroy, a three month steer, breaking his leg. The break was where your wrist would be - so his front right leg. A huge thank you to Dr. Schommer and Dr. Engel for connecting with us to cast it. sell. After Eggert's, the carcasses move to Ross' Locker in Glenwood City where they are cut into saleable pieces as retail cuts. It was fantastic to see all those students and adults want to learn more about how meat makes it from the farm to the table. A HUGE thanks to Pete Kruschke and Mark Konu who were our partners in transportation of the steers to Eggert's. We all enjoyed lunch at Not Justa Cafe after our work was done. Thanks to their staff for preparing and serving us delicious food. Stay tuned for the future steak sales on social media as it's difficult to obtain fresher meat than what we offer!

Loading cattle for processing was made soooo much easier by the work of JHaas Excavating and the new driveway system they put in for us in late June. It's magical. We were loaded and on our way in less than 10 minutes this time and in the past we were stuck in the mud around the house. We all LOVE our new driveway! Thank you!

Speaking of that driveway project, a shout out goes to our district's Building and Grounds and Maintenance staff led by Jon Thompson. They have all worked diligently to really help with odds and ends at the farm that hadn't been done in years past. Thank you for your investment of time and resources to help improve the SOAR Center!


money to defray the cost of their trip.
