# BOARD OF EDUCATION AND DISTRICT INFORMATION

The Board of Education is the governing body of the District. It is comprised of seven district residents elected to three-year terms. The Board of Education establishes policies and goals and has final control of all district matters with the framework set by the State Legislature and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.

The District Administrator is an ex-officio member of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of the school district. He is responsible for advising the Board on all matters and for executing Board policies and decisions.

Regular Board of Education meetings are generally scheduled on the third Monday of each month at the District Office. Occasionally meeting times and places are adjusted because of calendar conflicts or other school and community events. An open forum is held at the beginning of each regularly scheduled Board of Education meeting. The purpose of the open forum is to allow district residents to communicate directly with the Board of Education regarding school district matters or concerns. Open meeting laws allow the Board to have limited discussion on topics raised during the open forum, though no action can be taken unless the matter has been formally noticed on the agenda. Privacy rules do not allow for discussion on any personnel matter or matters concerning individual employees. Additional guidelines regarding the open forum are available from the district office.

Inquiries, individual concerns, or problems of any sort can be directed to the classroom teacher, the building principal, the District Administrator, or the Board of Education. Minutes of Board of Education meetings are published in the *Star-Observer*. Agendas are posted at the district office and on the district website. Agendas are also made available at each Board of Education meeting.

# ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is necessary for your child’s success. It is necessary for you to call your child’s school if s/he is going to be absent or tardy. **Absences/Tardiness:** A doctor’s excuse may be needed for any student absent from school for more than 3 consecutive days.

- ◆ Hillside Elementary, Paperjack Elementary and Starr Elementary students are considered tardy if they are not in their classroom at 8:45 a.m. After 9:05 a.m. they are considered absent for the morning. Students leaving school before 3:35 p.m. are considered absent for the afternoon.
- ◆ If a Middle School student arrives to class after the second bell has rung, s/he is considered tardy.
- ◆ If a High School student arrives to class after the second bell has rung, s/he is considered tardy. If a student is more than 10 minutes late to class, s/he will be considered absent from that class.

# SCHOOL NUTRITION PROGRAM

Menus are planned to meet the nutritional needs of all ages served and follow national guidelines to lower total intake of fat, saturated and trans fat, salt and sugar. Students may participate in the district meal program or bring a lunch from home. The district meal program involves lunch, breakfast, extra entrée servings, healthy snacks, extra milk purchased at meals and milk break at Hillside, Paperjack and Starr Elementary. If bringing a lunch from home, please pack items accordingly to keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold.

Families participating in the district meal program should deposit, in advance, a minimum of \$25.00 per student account with your first deposit. Please mail or bring in your first deposit before school begins so there are no problems with your child’s meal the first day of school. We also offer automatic payment options such as credit card and direct deposit through a link from our district website. The cost of the meal is then automatically deducted from the student account. When the account reaches a minimum balance of \$2.00 for reduced students or \$10.00 for paid students, our district phone system will automatically call you at home. We also offer e-mail notification for your convenience. This system will reduce our reliance on the children and will provide a quicker means of providing account information.

- ◆ The School Nutrition Department will be taking extreme caution when providing food to children in our buildings for the 2023-2024 school year due to the COVID19 pandemic. Please rest assured that our staff will receive training and food will be provided to students with the utmost care.

- ◆ Nutrient information available upon request.
- ◆ Special diet requests require a recognized medical authority’s order. A special diet order form is available on our district website under the School Nutrition Department.
- ◆ Free and reduced price meals, including breakfast and lunch, are available for students who qualify under federal guidelines. Please visit the website for free and reduced price meal applications.

# SCHOOL BUS RULES

- A. General**
- ◆ Parents and pupils must realize that school bus transportation is a privilege, not a right.
  - ◆ Be informed that misbehavior will not be tolerated. Pupils who misbehave can be suspended from school and be denied the privilege of riding on the bus.
- B. Pupil/Parent Responsibilities**
- ◆ Pupils will ride on assigned buses.
  - ◆ Pupils will board and disembark from their assigned bus at designated stops.
  - ◆ Call the bus company for temporary exceptions to the rule that students ride on assigned buses. Permission for exceptions will only be granted for emergency reasons and will be dependent on room available.
  - ◆ Forward requests for permanent exceptions to the rule that students ride on assigned buses to the district Director of Fiscal and Building Operations.
  - ◆ Assume responsibility for rides when permission is granted to be let off at a stop other than the regular stop.
  - ◆ Obtain and forward to the Director of Fiscal and Building Operation's office a certificate or statement from a medical doctor to substantiate all physically handicapping cases. Temporary handicap will require an annual statement and permanent handicap will require only an initial statement.
  - ◆ Inform the driver, if possible, when a rider will be absent.
- C. Previous To Boarding The Bus Riders Shall:**
- ◆ (On the road and at school)
  - ◆ Be at the designated school bus stop on time.
  - ◆ Stay off the road while waiting for the bus and conduct themselves in a safe manner while waiting.
  - ◆ Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before attempting to board the bus. Line up in a single file orderly manner and not rush to get on the bus.
  - ◆ Be courteous. Do not take advantage of younger students in order to get a seat.
  - ◆ Walk to the side of the road facing traffic to get to the bus stop if there is no sidewalk or path.
  - ◆ Use the handrail and watch their step when boarding the bus.
- D. While On The Bus Riders Shall:**
- ◆ Not open windows more than two notches.
  - ◆ Keep entire body inside the bus at all times.
  - ◆ Assist in keeping the bus safe and sanitary at all times. Do not eat or drink on the bus.
  - ◆ Remember loud talking, laughing or unnecessary confusion diverts the driver's attention and may result in a serious accident.
  - ◆ Treat bus equipment as valuable property. Damage to seats, etc., must be paid for by the offender.
  - ◆ Never tamper with the bus or any of its equipment.
  - ◆ Not leave books, lunches or other articles on the bus.
  - ◆ Keep books, packages, coats and all other objects out of the aisles.
  - ◆ Remain in the bus in case of a road emergency unless directed to do otherwise by the driver.
  - ◆ Not throw anything out of the window.
- E. After Leaving The Bus Riders Shall:**
- ◆ Cross the road at least 10 feet in front of the bus, but only after checking to be sure no traffic is approaching and after receiving a signal from the driver.
  - ◆ Help look after the safety and comfort of small children.
  - ◆ Be alert for the pre-arranged danger signal from the driver.
- F. Extra-Curricular Activity Bus Trips**
- ◆ The above rules and regulations also apply to any trip under school sponsorship.
  - ◆ Bus riders shall respect the wishes of chaperones appointed by school officials to accompany bus riders.
- G. Rule Violations:** The first time a student is disciplined for bus conduct, the student receives a verbal warning from the bus driver. If a student is written up on a Bus Conduct Report the following discipline plan will be followed:
- First Offense:** Written report to the School (School will contact parent).  
**Second Offense:** 1 day suspension from riding the bus.  
**Third Offense:** 3 day suspension from riding the bus.  
**Fourth Offense:** 5 day suspension from riding the bus.  
**Fifth Offense:** Suspension of all bus riding privileges including field trips for the remainder of the year (minimum of one semester.)
- The building principal reserves the right to take disciplinary action toward a student at his/her discretion.
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- Drawstrings on jackets, sweatshirts and other clothing items pose a danger to your child.** They can become snagged on school bus handrails or doors, on playground equipment, on escalators or other mechanical equipment. Incidents of snagged drawstrings or toggles have resulted in injuries and even deaths. *We don't want this to happen to any of our passengers.*
- Information campaigns by the National Safety Council, the U.S. Department of Transportation and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission have caused many clothing manufacturers to eliminate drawstrings from their clothing. But some still remain. We at North American Central School Bus, in conjunction with your school officials, urge you to inspect all of your children's clothing and eliminate these hazards wherever possible. *The simplest solution is to either remove or cut all drawstrings from the clothing.*

# STUDENT IMMUNIZATION LAW AGE/GRADE REQUIREMENTS

The following are the minimum required immunizations for each age/grade level according to the Wisconsin Student Immunization Law. Additional immunizations may be recommended for your child depending on his/her age. Please contact your doctor or St. Croix County Public Health (715-246-8263) to determine if your child needs additional immunizations.

<sup>1</sup>Children > 4 years of age who are enrolled in a Pre-K class should be assessed using the immunization requirements for Kindergarten through Grade 5 which would normally correspond to the individual's age.  
<sup>2</sup>D=diphtheria, T=tetanus, P=pertussis vaccine. DTaP/DTP/DT/Td vaccine for all students Pre-K through 12. Four doses are required. However, if a student received the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday, further doses are not required. Note: a dose four days or less before the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday is also acceptable.  
<sup>3</sup>DTaP/DTP/DT vaccine for children entering Kindergarten. Each student must have received one dose after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday (either the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, or 5<sup>th</sup> dose) to be compliant. Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday is also acceptable.  
<sup>4</sup>Tdap is adolescent tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis combination vaccine. If a student received a dose of tetanus-containing vaccine, such as Td, within 5 years before entering the grade in which Tdap is required, the student is compliant and a dose of Tdap vaccine is not required.  
<sup>5</sup>Polio vaccine for students entering grades Kindergarten through 12: Four doses are required. However, if a student received the 3<sup>rd</sup> dose after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday, further doses are not required. Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday is also acceptable.  
<sup>6</sup>MMR is measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine. The first dose of MMR vaccine must have been received on or after the first birthday. Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday is also acceptable. Laboratory evidence of immunity to all three diseases (measles and mumps and rubella) is also acceptable.  
<sup>8</sup>Varicella vaccine is chickenpox vaccine. A history of chickenpox disease or laboratory evidence of immunity to varicella is also acceptable.

To be compliant, parents need to report the date of the:

- ◆ First dose no later than the 30<sup>th</sup> school day;
- ◆ Second dose no later than the 90<sup>th</sup> school day;
- ◆ Third dose no later than the 30<sup>th</sup> school day from the start of the following school year.
- ◆ Waivers for health, religious and personal conviction reasons are available.
- ◆ Any student who does not have the immunization requirements by the above time frame will be reported to the St. Croix County Health Department for non-compliance. This can result in a fine of up to \$25.00 per day for non-compliance.

Immunizations can be obtained from your personal physician or they can be received from the St. Croix County Public Health Office if you have no insurance, Medicaid/BadgerCare or are underinsured. There is a \$5.00 administration fee per vaccine. Students under the age of 18 must have a parent/guardian signature or be accompanied by a parent/guardian to receive any immunizations. Appointments are needed to receive vaccinations. Call 715-246-8263 to schedule an appointment.

## HEALTH SERVICE SCREENINGS

Screening programs by the School District Health Services Staff include:

- ◆ Grades Kindergarten, 1, 3 and 5: vision and hearing (Fall 2023);
- ◆ Grade 7: vision (January 2024);
- ◆ All students new to the school district this school year;
- ◆ Students grades 1-8 referred the previous year and the school district has not received follow-up information.

Parents may opt their child out of any or all screenings by calling the health assistant prior to the screening, preferably at the onset of each school year since screenings occur sporadically throughout the school year.

## ACCESS TO STUDENT RECORDS

The Board recognizes the need for confidentiality of student records. Therefore, student's records shall be available for inspection or release only with prior approval of the parent/guardian or adult student, except in situations where legal requirements specify release of records without such prior approval. The Board has established guidelines relative to the collection, storage, retrieval, use and destruction of student records. Such procedures shall be in accordance with state and federal law and are identified in Board Policy Number 8330. Copies of the policy can be obtained at the District Office, 837 East 11th Street, New Richmond, WI 54017 or on the District website. Information on the procedure for filing a complaint with the Family Policy and Regulation Office of the Department of Education is available at the District Office. A list of all persons who handle or have access to personally identifiable information shall be posted in accordance with state and federal law requirements and established procedures. Student record notices shall be published in accordance with state law.

## ANNUAL NOTICE TO PARENTS AND ELIGIBLE STUDENTS ON STUDENT RECORDS AND DATA PRIVACY

Pursuant to the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act and Wisconsin Statute 118.125, the School District of New Richmond has identified selected information relating to students called "directory information". This information is to be considered public information and may be released by the school district. Items considered to be directory information are as follows:

- ◆ Student's Name
- ◆ Photographs or videotapes for school approved publications or other school approved use
- ◆ Co-curricular and Athletics
- ◆ Height and weight, if a member of an athletic team
- ◆ Awards received

While the school district must obtain and use certain information about each student in order to plan the best program possible, this need must be balanced with the right of each student and parent to privacy. Therefore, access to school information is limited and controlled.

If you do not want the School District of New Richmond to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the District in writing within fourteen (14) days of the publication of such notice in the *Fall Edition District Newsletter*, the official publication of the school district.

## COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

The Board of Education is committed to providing an equal educational opportunity for all students in the District. The Board does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital status, parental status, sexual orientation, sex (including transgender status, change of sex or gender identity), military status or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability ("Protected Classes") in any of its student programs and activities.
