# **\*YOU WILL RECEIVE INFORMATION AT A LATER DATE FOR FINAL SUMMER OFFERINGS AND REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

- Students can take up to 2 summer classes There are two sessions, one in the morning (7:30-11:15) and one in the afternoon (11:45-3:30), so you can sign up for up to 2 classes. \*Marching Band can be taken as a 3<sup>rd</sup>, as it meets a different times.
- Final dates have not be set yet however, summer term is generally first full 3 weeks of summer for all courses, besides PE.
- Summer P.E. runs through June and July with a break for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. However, PE only meets M-Th, so you can come on Fridays to make up for missed time.
- In order to receive credit, students cannot miss more than 6 hours of any summer class.
- If you sign up for a summer class that you later realize you can't take due to a vacation or other commitment, you can drop the course by contacting the high school front office.
- If you end up taking summer school for a class you also registered for during the school year (example: Health) OR ended up not taking a class you thought you'd take in the summer and now need it during the school year, you can request a change through our online schedule change form after you receive your schedule in August.

# **GRADE 9 REQUIREMENTS**

#### • What your day looks like:

- 8 class periods per day; 7 classes and Tiger Time daily.
- 45 minutes per class
- 30 minutes for lunch (3 lunch periods based on 5<sup>th</sup> hour class)
- 5 minutes between classes

#### • Classes you are required to take:

- English 9 (or Enriched English 9)
- Modern World History (or AP Modern World History)
- Principles of Science
- Math (Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1, Geometry or Algebra 2)
- General Phy Ed\*
- Health\*

\*You can take these courses anytime during your 4 years, but it is recommended freshman year or over summer.

#### • Electives:

- You will have room in your schedule to take up to 3 elective classes of your choice, this could include semester or full-year elective courses, a study hall, band, choir, or Spanish. Freshman options are listed on the following sheet and in the Course Offerings Handbook. \**Make sure you list at least 3 alternate electives on your Course Selection form just in case your first choice of elective does not fit in your schedule.*
- You must have at least 6 classes and no more than 7 classes each semester. If you sign up for only 6 classes, your 7<sup>th</sup> class will be filled with a study hall.

#### • Things to remember:

- It can be helpful to take a study hall especially during your first semester until you feel adjusted to high school. They are also useful if you are in athletics or other clubs/activities that may take up time after school. Students are able to take a study hall every semester of high school and still have more credits than needed to graduate, as long as there aren't classes failed.
- The High School has two freshman support classes, Success Study Hall and Reading, that students may be scheduled for based on grades, testing, or teacher recommendations from 8<sup>th</sup> grade. They are designed to help you get off to a good start in high school, and if scheduled into them, they are a requirement. Even though a student may not be able to take all desired electives if this occurs, we find students are much more successful due to these supports, and they can take those electives in the future.

# **GRADE 9 ELECTIVE COURSES**

## Please keep in mind:

- Not every course is offered both first **and** second semester, some may be one or the other.
- **PLEASE** refer to your *course offerings handbook* for specific prerequisites and details about courses before registering. Many courses have grade level requirements or prerequisite courses which must be taken before a student can take certain courses.
- The courses below are one semester long unless otherwise noted.
- MAKE SURE TO REQUEST 3 ALTERNATE ELECTIVES. There may be times a course you request will not fit your final schedule, or isn't offered due to course enrollment, or other reasons, so we need those other alternate courses entered to ensure you get a course you would like.

# **SCHEDULING STEPS**

# **\*\*** SCHEDULING DEADLINE: MONDAY, MARCH 4th\*\*

**NOTE**: SCHEDULING CAN ONLY BE COMPLETED THROUGH THE **<u>STUDENT'S</u>** SKYWARD ACCOUNT!

- 1. Fully fill out your course selection sheet with your course requests and course numbers. This will help as you enter courses on Skyward.
- Log into your STUDENT Skyward account. This cannot be completed through the parent account.
  \*\*If you have issues logging in (forgot password, locked out) inform school staff so this can be corrected\*\*
- 3. Click the drop down at the top to make sure you are under the High School entity and not Middle School (otherwise none of the options below will show up).
- 4. Click on **"Schedule"** on the left side of the screen.
- 5. Click "Request Courses for 2024-25 at High School".
- 6. The REQUEST COURSES section allows you to view all classes available, and add courses. To add your remaining classes, enter the course number in the search bar at the bottom of the screen. The class will then pop up. Click the course you want to highlight it, and then click "Add Course", and it will show up on the right side of the screen under "Courses Requested".
- 7. Required courses will already be added for you. Math will be held with "MATH -TBD". It also will be added for you at a later date based on level. To add advanced classes (Enriched English or AP Modern World History), circle it on your course selection sheet, and add it to your requests in Skyward. It will look like you are doubled up, but we will remove the other version for you later.
- 8. After all remaining classes are added, you will see them all in the **SELECTED COURSES** column on the right. You will have 12 slots filled if you want a study hall all year, 13 slots for a study hall just one semester, and 14 slots if you do not want a study hall at all.
- 9. Next, click on the **ALTERNATE** tab to add 3 alternate elective courses. These courses will be substituted if there are scheduling conflicts with student's first choice of electives. It is VERY important to complete this step.
- Once entered, the classes save automatically. You do <u>NOT</u> need to click a save or submit button. You can also access your requests anytime during the scheduling window to add/remove the courses you want until the scheduling window closes.
- 11. Once all courses are entered in Skyward, turn your **Pink Course Selection Sheet** into Mrs. Gretzlock at the Middle School.
