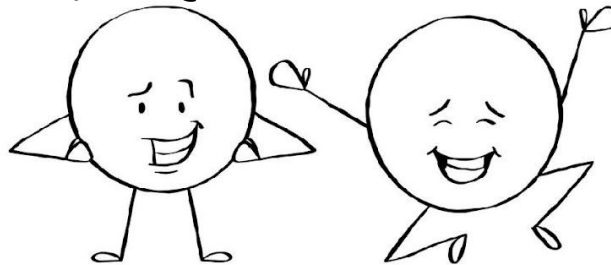

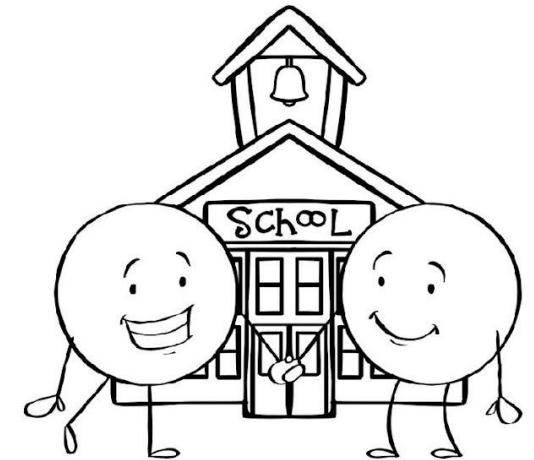

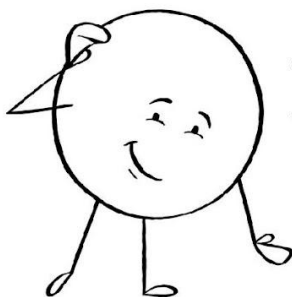

- Parent events focused on relevant topics such as technology safety, homework support, anxiety, and more!



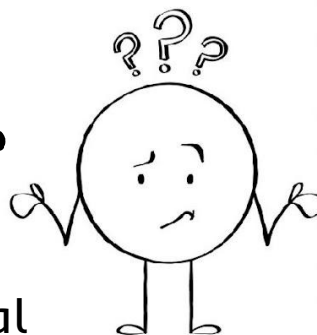

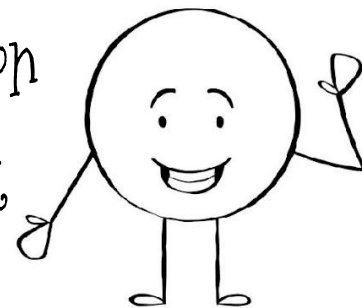
