Achieving our goals will take a commitment to continuous learning on the part of our talented and motivated team of staff members, informed and supportive parents, and a community that values education. As a District, we are committed to making sure our students receive the best possible education based on our knowledge of their learning, where to take them next, and how to get them there! Student achievement remains our highest priority because when our children succeed, we all succeed due to the contributions young minds can make to our society and the communities in which we live.

## 2021-2022 DISTRICT GOALS

- Each building will reduce the achievement GAP as determined by Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's school accountability report card.
- Be recognized as a top performing District as measured by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's school accountability report card.
- By grade, increase by ten percentage points from the fall score to the spring score the number of students at or above the District target benchmark in Reading for 2021-2021 in grades 1-9.
- By grade, increase by ten percentage points from the fall score to the spring score the number of students at or above the District target benchmark in Math for 2021-2022 in grades 1-8.
- By third grade when students take the Wisconsin Forward Exam, 65% of students will show proficiency in reading.
- By eighth grade when students take the Wisconsin Forward Exam, 65% of students will show proficiency in math.
- Achieve an average composite score of 22 or higher on the Spring 2022 ACT state assessment at grade 11.

Our students continue to excel in every arena which includes the classroom, performing arts, extracurricular activities, and on the athletic field. Our team of staff members are highly qualified professionals, who care deeply about the success of all our students.
